Thrive Youth Center is the only organization in San Antonio specifically serving LGBTQ youth 18-24 who are experiencing homelessness. Thrive provides unsheltered youth community based resources necessary to exit homelessness through our outreach program, houses LGBTQ youth in the emergency shelter on the campus of Haven for Hope, and facilitates one and two year HUD housing programs for any youth 18-24. All programming is youth-centered with direct and wraparound services to assist them in exiting homelessness.

Providence Place has been in existence since 1895 and provides multi-purpose programming to various populations. These include adult women survivors of complex trauma, women facing an unplanned pregnancy, families with young children, and children and youth in foster care. We provide education, job search and therapeutic services to move individuals beyond day to day survival. We want everyone to have the opportunity to envision a different future and transform their story.

RMYA restores hope and healing to children traumatized by abuse and violence. They offer a 24-hour drop-in center, emergency shelter services, long-term residential care and a transitional living program that provides a sanctuary for homeless youth. Additionally, the RMYA family counseling and resource center provides trauma-informed therapy and a psychiatric clinic to community children and families to prevent child abuse and improve relationships. RMYA promotes individual success and healthy relationships in a safe, healing environment, giving children and families the tools to end the cycle of abuse. RMYA will engage in the SARAH #WESay programming to further their outreach to children and youth at risk of homelessness, trafficking and other forms of abuse and violence.

The University of Texas at San Antonio (UTSA), Texas A&M San Antonio (A&M-SA), and the Alamo Colleges District (ACD) have developed an innovative pilot program to create a pipeline of educational support for the more than 600 foster care alumni currently enrolled on our campuses, as well as youth in foster care who aspire to go to college. The pilot will enhance existing resources and practices, and develop targeted support to increase access, retention, and graduation rates for foster care alumni. This group will engage in the SARAH #WESay programming to further the pilot outreach.
