- **C.** Participant Eligibility Projects funded through the Unsheltered Homeless Set Aside must serve project participants meeting one of the following eligibility criteria:
 - 1. Paragraph (1) of the definition of homeless at 578.3 An individual or family who lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence, meaning:
 - An individual or family with a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings, including a car, park, abandoned building, bus or train station, airport, or camping ground.
 - An individual or family living in a supervised publicly or privately operated shelter designated to provide temporary living arrangements (including congregate shelters, transitional housing, and hotels and motels paid for by charitable organizations or by federal, State, or local government programs for low-income individuals).
 - Persons coming from transitional housing must have originally come from places not meant for human habitation, emergency shelters, safe havens, or institutions where they resided for 90 days or less and originally came from places not meant for human habitation, safe havens, or emergency shelters.
 - An individual who is exiting an institution where he or she resided for 90 days or less and who resided in an <u>emergency shelter</u> or place not meant for human habitation immediately before entering that institution.
 - __ 2. Paragraph (4) of the definition of homeless at 578.3 Any individual or family who:
 - Is fleeing, or is attempting to flee, domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, or other dangerous or life-threatening conditions that relate to violence against the individual or a family member, including a child, that has either taken place within the individual's or family's primary nighttime residence or has made the individual or family afraid to return to their primary nighttime residence.
 - Has no other residence, and
 - Lacks the resources or support networks, *e.g.*, family, friends, and faith-based or other social networks, to obtain other permanent housing.
